## **COC** guidelines for selecting the HST:

- ✓ Number of practitioners selected from the Expert Groups will be determined after the NSF practitioners are selected. *Note: A major portion of the HST will be selected through an NSF application / nomination process independent from this procedure*
- ✓ While the COC will take into consideration the rankings of applicants by their Expert Groups, the COC reserves the right to make selections to the HST based on:
  - 1. The needs and requirement of the different sports, and the overall HST
  - 2. Appropriate balance of skill sets
  - 3. Gender equity
  - 4. Availability of health care services to the Canadian delegation in both official languages
  - 5. The limited number of accreditations available.

Note: in some cases, accreditations may be "shared" between individuals on the Mission Team

### If selected, all practitioners are required to:

- Report to the Chief Medical Officer (CMO) and/or the Chief Therapist (CT) throughout the Games;
- Have appropriate liability insurance to practice in Peru;
- Physicians will be required to comply with all pre-Games requirements to obtain a license to practice in the host country for the Games;
- Provide their services to Canadian Team members only;
- Familiarize themselves with their assigned sport(s); and if requested by the CD/CT attend a training camp, competition and/or meet with the team(s);
- Attend the Team Operations and Preparation Seminar (TOPS) in April 2019 (Location and Dates TBD);
- Provide health care support to the entire Canadian Team; this will include working at the Canadian Health Centre(s), Performance Centre(s) and/or assignments to a variety of sports during the Games period;
- Stay until the end of the Games (if requested by the CMO/CT) to support the overall health care operation and participate in the pack-up of the Canadian Health Centre. <u>However</u>, they may also be asked to leave once their assigned sport has finished competing, in order to transfer their accreditation to another person. <u>Note:</u> some members of the HST may not be officially accredited for the Games; i.e. they will access the village with daily guest passes;
- Wear the official clothing provided by the Canadian Olympic Committee (COC) while on duty at the Health Centre and during official COC functions;
- Stay in the accommodation provided by the COC which could be outside the Village;
- Utilize travel services provided by the COC;
- Attend Canadian HST meetings at Games, as determined by the CMO and/or CT;
- Sign the COC "Mission Team" Agreement and consent to a security and/or criminal screening.
